Captain Speeches


It was wonderful to see the standard of speeches presented last week by hopeful candidates.

Student leadership

A few weeks ago, Year 5 students participated in a Leadership Unit which centred around the Pixar animation, 'A Bug's Life'.

Students were given the option to respond to aspects of the film in relation to leadership. Following are a few examples.

A Bug's Life by Georgia Green

The Disney Pixar animation "A Bug's Life" teaches the viewer about leadership skills. Although we may perceive the film to simply be a battle between ants and grasshoppers, if you consider it differently you may notice some effective and non-effective leadership qualities.

The first form of leadership in the film is seen through the character of 'Mr Soil' who leads an assembly of ants around 'the leaf'. His strategy is to use patience and to be encouraging. His approach is very effective; the ants in trouble were calmed and assured by his words.

The Queen has a leadership style that is laid back and confident. This manner causes the rest of the colony to feel relaxed. It is quite effective.

On the other hand, Princess Atta is panicked and rushed so nobody believes that she could be trusted to be the Queen. Towards the second half of the film she becomes more confident and the other ants begin to believe in her.

Dot and Flik have very similar strategies of leading other ants and insects around. Both are confident and brave and want to make a difference. Neither of them are in a particular position of leadership. Flik is an ordinary ant who tries (and fails) to make things easier for the colony. After continually being reprimanded by the Queen's official she doubts herself. Dot is a royal ant who has, for her entire life lived in the shadows of her sister (Princess Atta) and her mother (The Queen). When it is time to stand up to the grasshoppers, Dot leads her little gang (The Blueberries) to safety.

Hopper is a vicious grasshopper who has a thirst for power and governs by making others fear him. Although he achieves what he wants it only takes one ant (person) to realise how unfair this style of leadership is.

Overall, these characters obviously show different forms of leadership. There is no doubt that this film has excellent lessons for all.


