Principal's Report

On the Wednesday and Thursday of Week 2, Amy Joy from 5/6J qualified to compete at the State Athletics Carnival held at Homebush. Amy achieved amazing results and even beat her own personal best time in the 200m run. Her results are as follows:

200m heat - 1st with a time of 29.02 sec

200m semi-final - 4th with a time of 28.76 (P.B.)

200m FINAL - 7th place with a time of 28.79

Amy also completed in the High Jump. She cleared her first jump at 130cm but was knocked out at the 135cm mark. Not only did Amy perform amazingly well at a state level, she was also an amazing ambassador of RVPS, and it is with much pride that we congratulate her on her outstanding achievement.

A personal high for Amy was getting to meet and speak to one of her idols – Melinda Gainsford Taylor. Well done Amy!

Book Club




Australian War Memorial - Memorial Box program

FRIENDLY KIDS, FRIENDLY CLASSROOMS

Students have been learning about positive tracking. Please take time to read the information below and discuss it with your child.

ASKING AN ADULT FOR SUPPORT

Stay cool.
When all else fails
You can ask for help.

Do's

Make sure you haven't tried other ways to deal with being given a hard time, *before* you ask an adult for support.

Make sure you really want to stop the annoying behaviour, not just get them into trouble.

Say "If you don't stop, I'll go and ask Mr Brown for support".

Approach a teacher, look in their eyes and stand tall.

In a firm voice, tell them what the problem is and what you have already tried to do to deal with it.



Dont's

Don't ask for adult support until after you've tried to deal with it yourself.

Don't just try to get the other person into trouble.

Don't choose an inconvenient time t talk to the teacher (unless it's an emergency).

Don't look up in the air or down at the ground.

Don't use a whingeing or complaining tone of voice.

Don't keep threatening to ask for support. Just say it once and then do it.

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Whooping cough information for schools

There is an outbreak of whooping cough (pertussis) in NSW, mainly affecting school-aged children.

Coughing spreads the infection to others nearby. Whooping cough can spread to anyone at home, including younger brothers and sisters. Whooping cough can be especially dangerous for babies.

Whooping cough starts like a cold and progresses to bouts of coughing that can last for many weeks. The infection can occur even in fully-vaccinated children. Older children may just have a cough that is persistent and may be worse at night.

- Children with these symptoms should see a doctor.
- If your doctor diagnoses whooping cough in your school-aged child, please let the school know and keep your child at home until they have taken 5 days of antibiotics. Keep coughing children away from babies.
- Whooping cough vaccines give good protection against infection but immunity fades with time. Check that all
 your children are up to date with their vaccines, due at 6 weeks, 4 months, 6 months, 4 years and 12 years of
 age (offered to all Year 7 students through the NSW school-based vaccination program). A booster is also
 recommended at 18 months of age.

A booster dose of vaccine is also recommended for adults that are in contact with young children, such as school staff and parents. Pregnant women are recommended to have a booster dose during each pregnancy and this is funded by NSW Health. Those who are new parents or carers of babies should consult their general practitioner about appropriate immunisation.


