#### HAVING AN INTERESTING CONVERSATION

Do's	Don'ts		
Look at the other person and smile. Ask a question or make a comment about something you have in common. Listen carefully when the other person is speaking.	Don't talk about things that the other person is not interested in. Don't fidget or let you mind wander.		
<ul><li>When they stop talking, take your turn, and either ask a good question or say something about the topic. Be positive.</li><li>While you are speaking, look to see that the other is interested in what you are saying.</li><li>Let them have a turn by pausing and looking in their eyes.</li></ul>	<ul><li>Don't expect the other person to do all the work in the conversation.</li><li>Don't interrupt.</li><li>Don't assume that the other person is interested in what you are saying. Check!</li><li>Don't hog the conversation.</li></ul>		
If you run out of thing to say or they seem uninterested, make a comment or ask another question about something else that you have in common.	Don't ask questions all the time. Make some comments.
